Interpretation


Answers the question, "What does the passage mean?"

Follow these basic rules:

- Remember that context always rules
 first
- Always seek the full counsel of the Word of God. (Compare and contrast similar passages.)
- 3. Remember that Scripture will never contradict Scripture.
- 4. Don't base your convictions on an obscure passage of Scripture.
- 5. Interpret Scripture literally.
- 6. Allegories and typology are used to illuminate, never to create.
- 7. The NT has priority.

Application

Answers the question, "What does it mean to me personally? What truths can I put into practice? What changes should I make to my life?"
