Genesis 6:5-9:17 • Starting Over with Noah

- 1. (6:5-10) It begins with someone who is spiritually <u>faithful</u> regardless of the <u>wicked world</u> around them.
- (6:11-22) On the one side God devotes to total <u>destruction</u>
 those on whom His <u>judgment</u> is directed; on the opposite side
 stand those <u>faithful</u> to Him with whom He makes <u>promises</u> of
 safety and redemption as strong as the <u>judgments</u> pronounced
 on the others.
- 3. (7:1-5) There is a period of <u>preaching</u> and <u>preparation</u> before the end ultimately comes.
- 4. (7:10-16) God chooses when to close the door forever.
- (8:1-9) God's judgment works to <u>destroy</u> the wicked because of their <u>inward</u> condition yet serves to <u>preserve</u> and <u>support</u> the righteous because of their <u>inward</u> condition.
- (8:13-19) The righteous never assume anything based on the <u>circumstances</u>, whether leading up to <u>judgment</u> or after it's subsided.
- 7. (8:20-22) For every covenant made between man and God, something has to be <u>sacrificed</u> to complete the deal.
- 8. (9:1-7) What God stated from the beginning remains the <u>same</u> regardless of mankind's failure to <u>obey</u> or attempts to <u>redefine</u> it.
- 9. (9:8-17) It ends with someone who is required to be spiritually **faithful** regardless of the **wicked world** around them.
