Genesis 18-19 • The Lord Investigates

- 1. (18:1-8) <u>Judgment</u> always begins first with the house of the Lord.
- 2. (18:9-15) The Lord is not just looking faithfulness in **deed** but **thought**.
- 3. (18:16-21) The purpose of the Lord's "<a href="mailto:chosen" is not just that they will be personally faithful, but that they will raise up others who will likewise be faithful.
- 4. (18:22-33) The Lord's <u>judgment</u> comes when all men have made their final <u>choice</u> for or against the <u>Lord</u> and will not <u>change</u> no matter what.
- 5. (19:1-3) The <u>righteous</u> are always proven so in their treatment of <u>others</u>.
- 6. (19:4-11) The <u>unrighteous</u> are always proven so in their treatment of <u>others</u> and uninterrupted pursuit of <u>pleasing</u> themselves.
- 7. (19:12-14) The Lord <u>lingers</u> as long as possible before executing <u>judgment</u>.
- 8. (19:15-22) The Lord's wrath of final judgment does not come until His people are first <u>rescued</u> and <u>removed</u>.
- (19:23-29) What the Lord uses for the purposes of judgment on the <u>wicked</u> has an entirely different purpose for the <u>righteous</u> in the course of their <u>service</u> and <u>commitment</u> to Him.
