## Genesis 21:1-31 • Testing Family Relationships

- 1. (v.1-8) Without true <u>faith</u>, there is no true <u>righteousness</u>. The fulfillment of God's promises come at the <u>appointed</u> time in order to allow a greater work of <u>faith</u> producing <u>righteousness</u> in our life.
- 2. (v.9-13) When one side of a relationship is hopelessly rooted in the <u>flesh</u> and the other steadfast in the <u>Spirit</u>, <u>separation</u> is required that God may properly work on both <u>independently</u>.
- 3. (v.14-21) God had his own <u>plan</u> and <u>appointed</u> time for Hagar, which was not compatible with Abraham's. Hagar and Ishmael were also <u>chosen</u> by God, but had to pursue their own <u>choices</u> by faith.
- 4. (Gal. 4:21-31)
- Hagar represents the Old Covenant of the <u>law</u>, associated with the earthly <u>Jerusalem</u> of Paul's day.
- Ishmael, the son of a <u>slave</u>, was born of the <u>flesh</u>.
- Ishmael is a picture of Old

  Testament Israel under <u>slavery</u> to the

  <u>Law</u>.
- Sarah represents the New Covenant of grace, associated with the heavenly Jerusalem.
- Isaac, the son of a <u>freewoman</u>, was born of the **Spirit**.
- Isaac is a picture of the New
   Testament Church under the <u>liberty</u>
   of <u>grace</u>.

Just as the old nature is <u>incompatible</u> with the new nature and <u>separation</u> needs to take place, so we are no longer under the <u>Law</u> so that the New Covenant of <u>promise</u> is to be exclusively pursued.
