Exodus 12:1-13 • The Blood of the Lamb

- 1. (12:1-13) Any house not <u>marked</u> with the blood of the lamb would suffer the judgment of <u>death</u>.
- 2. (12:14, 40-42) Those so <u>marked</u> are delivered from the <u>bondage</u> of their old life as represented by <u>Egypt</u>.
- 3. (Gen. 3:21) True spiritual protection requires the **shedding** of **blood**.
- 4. (Gen. 4:3-5a) An acceptable <u>sacrifice</u> requires the <u>shedding</u> of <u>blood</u>.
- 5. (Mt. 1:20-21, Jn. 1:29, Jn. 19:34, Rom. 5:9, Heb. 9:13-14) The Passover lamb is representative of the work of Christ to come:
 - a. Christ willingly offered Himself as a sacrifice.
 - b. Christ's innocent blood was shed.
 - c. Christ's blood was shed on a <u>wooden cross</u>, symbolized by the doorpost and crossbar.
 - d. Those covered by Christ's blood are protected from judgment.
 - e. It marks the beginning of our <u>deliverance</u> from the bondage of <u>sin</u>.
 - f. Rom. 3:21-26
