Exodus 20:1-17 • The First Ten Laws of Love

- 1. (v.1-7) The "first tablet" are commandments involving man's relationship to <u>God</u>.
 - a. Mankind violates the 1st commandment by practicing pluralism.
 - b. Mankind violates the 2nd commandment by making idols of gods, people, or things.
 - c. Mankind violates the 3rd commandment by making God's name the most common form of swearing.
 - d. If God is not allowed to be God in a person's life, they will inevitably make their self god.
- 2. (v.8-11) The 4th commandment was a kind of "<u>hinge</u>" between God and man.
 - a. Jesus states this commandment relates to man. (Mk. 2:27)
 - b. The purpose was to serve as Israel's visible testimony.
 - c. It is binding on <u>Israel</u>, not the <u>Church</u>. (Rom. 6:14; Col. 2:16)
- 3. (v.12-17) The "second tablet" are commandments involving man's relationship with man.
 - a. The WHOLE Law, however, is fulfilled by <u>love</u>. (Gal. 5:13-14)
 - b. Jesus' definition of love: "This is My commandment, that you love one another, just as <u>I have loved you</u>." (Jn. 15:12)
 - c. When it comes to the commandments it's not an issue of <u>obedience</u>, but <u>love</u>.
 - d. We haven't "thrown out" the Law, we've instead superimposed <u>love</u> on it to properly fulfill it.
 - e. The Law of Love covers every situation <u>NOT</u> specifically referenced in <u>Scripture</u>. (Gal. 3:19-29)
