Numbers 25 • Jealous for God

- 1. (v.1-3) What could not be accomplished by war, sorcery, or divination came about through sexual immorality—an attack on one's personal relationship with God.
- 2. (v.4-5) A <u>faithful</u> believer already knows what to do in the presence of <u>unfaithfulness</u>.
- 3. (v.6-9) Sexual immorality which corrupts one <u>personally</u> inevitably leads to corruption of the things of God <u>publicly</u>.
- 4. (v.10-13) Biblical <u>jealousy</u> is a consuming, single-minded <u>pursuit</u> of God's will and ways.
- 5. (v.14-18) These kinds of influences come from sources which gain the <u>trust</u> and <u>confidence</u> of believers. First they <u>infiltrate</u>, then they <u>turn on them</u>.
