Deuteronomy • The Consequences of Love

- 1. (4:35-38) God's love initiates His <u>calling</u> so we may be <u>transformed</u> by His Word.
- 2. (7:6-13) There is no biblical <u>love</u> without biblical <u>truth</u> in either our <u>beliefs</u> or our <u>behavior</u>.
- (10:12-13) The only genuine <u>respect</u> (biblically called "fear") in the course of <u>service</u> to God is qualified by <u>devotion</u> to His Word and ways. Such all come together to define what it biblically means to <u>love</u> God.
- (13:1-3) Genuine love for God will always <u>embrace</u> and <u>practice</u>
 His Word in the course of <u>rejecting</u> a false or deceptive <u>counterfeit</u>.
- 5. (30:19-20) Biblical love is a personal **choice** which cannot be separated from **obedience** to His Word and ways.
- 6. (6:5) "All your heart", "all your soul" and "all your might" describe the effort we put into our obedience to God's Word and ways to accomplish the goal of biblical love for God.
- 7. (30:11-14) Biblical love is only <u>difficult</u> if pursued <u>apart</u> from God's Word.

Overall Application (1 Tim. 1:5)

The achievement of God's love in our life is only possible by a total <u>personal</u> commitment to His Word at every level—our <u>heart</u>, <u>mind</u> and <u>soul</u>.
