Deuteronomy 8 • How God Uses the Necessities

1.	(v.1-5) God's Word is not only a complete guide for physical life, it is required to sustain spiritual life.
2.	(v.6-10) Biblically speaking, "hunger" represents spiritual famine whereas "plenty" represents spiritual blessings.
3.	(v.11-17) Pride is evident when one embraces the false belief that they have accomplished everything on their own.
4.	(v.18-20) Biblically speaking, one who " <u>listens</u> " is proven to the degree that they <u>obey</u> and put God's <u>Word</u> into practice.
