Deuteronomy 27-28 • The Two Witnesses

- 1. (27:1-8) It is not about merely hearing or reciting **God's Word**, but putting it into practice.
- 2. (27:9-10) Obedience to God's Word is not only an **individual** requirement, but together for the whole of God's **people**.
- 3. (27:11-26) The most visible proof of the quality of our faith and obedience is revealed in our <u>relationships</u> with <u>others</u>.
- 4. (28:1-14) The greater goal is to become so personally obedient that God's people become a visible <u>witness</u> to the rest of the world. Disobedience is actually a visible <u>witness</u> of false worship. What is not of <u>God</u> is of the <u>world</u>.
- (28:15-26) Disobedience to God's Word results in a visible breakdown in both our personal and spiritual <u>relationships</u>. Unfortunately, <u>unfaithfulness</u> is as powerful a witness to the non-believing world as <u>faithfulness</u>.
- (28:27-46) Just as signs and wonders are intended to convey the greater importance of accepting God's <u>message</u> which accompanies them, so too are the signs and wonders of God's <u>judgment</u> which come upon His people for unfaithfulness.
- 7. (28:47-57) <u>Unresponsiveness</u> to God's judgment inevitably leads to even greater <u>judgment</u>.
- 8. (28:58-68) God's people are not to return to **Egypt**—a biblical metaphor for the old life from which they were saved, but the consequences of the old life (and worse) await the previously faithful when all else fails.
