Judges 6 • From Farmer to Warrior

1. (v.1-6) This is not purely a <u>test</u> of faith, but far more the consequences of sin.

 (v.7-10) When it comes to reconciliation of sin for the backslidden, immediate relief from the consequences is not guaranteed. The first stage may be reproof on the issue of sin.

3. (v.11-16) The called of God may need to first be awakened to trusting in <u>themselves</u> as a prelude to trusting <u>God</u>.

4. (v.17-23) The called of God approach Him in <u>faith</u> in all matters of <u>faith</u>. They are quick to render to <u>God</u> that which is due <u>God</u>.

5. (v.24-27) The repentance and reconciliation of the whole is repeatedly demonstrated throughout Scripture as always beginning with the few, or even the one. It always begins with repentance as exemplified by the altar. 6. (v.28-32) Those authentically called by God often preface their greater **global** work by first setting things right **locally**. It **prepares** them for the greater work to come.

7. (v.33-35) Those called by <u>God</u> in turn are used by <u>God</u> to call others to <u>God</u>.

8. (v.36-40) Those called by God may certainly seek <u>confirmation</u> from God, which he will most assuredly affirm by a <u>test</u> of faith in Him.

Overall Application:

- It begins with the singular <u>calling</u> of an individual.
- The first work is an individual <u>sacrifice</u> and <u>offering</u> to God. (Rom. 12:1-2)
- This is closely followed by cleaning up the immediate area of influence to establish a spiritual stronghold in the Lord.
- It then influences those <u>closest</u>, always involving true <u>repentance</u> combined with a return to the <u>Word</u>.
- There will be <u>tests</u> of faith along the way.
- The individual <u>calling</u> always results in the greater <u>glory</u> of God.
