Judges 16:1-21 • The Incompatibility of a Sin-Based Relationship

- 1. (v.1) Samson believes he can operate completely on his own without the support of those on his side as well as make his own rules.
- 2. (v.2-3) Samson incorrectly assumes he is powerful enough to overcome his own <u>sin</u> and becomes a <u>law</u> unto himself.
- 3. (v.4-5) By not leaving the <u>enemy's</u> territory and influence, Samson gives them time and opportunity to <u>succeed</u>.
- 4. (v.6-9) Samson's primary weakness is **pride**, which will the very point of the enemy's attack.
- 5. (v.10-14) The enemy used Samson's own standards against him.
- 6. (v.15) Continued close contact finally made it a <u>personal</u> issue for Samson.
- 7. (v.16-18a) As with all spiritual warfare, the <u>heart</u> is the ultimate goal.
- 8. (v.18b-20) The Lord was gone from Samson's life in terms of the choices made and <a href="https://chaices.com/chaices
- (v.21) Ultimately Samson's <u>physical</u> condition mirrored his <u>spiritual</u> condition—blind, bound, and working <u>for</u> the enemy instead of <u>against</u> them.
