Judges 17-18 • How to Start a False Religion

- (17:1-3) A false religion begins with false <u>teaching</u>, most often using the very terms and name of God as if such tricks of vocabulary can give them <u>legitimacy</u>. They will often hold up <u>moral</u> examples of behavior which, in reality, are not good <u>spiritual</u> examples, but have the air and feel of <u>respectability</u>.
- (17:4-6) A false religion <u>duplicates</u> the structures, organization, and even many of the practices of <u>Christianity</u> for a single, bottom line purpose: To do what is <u>right</u> in their own eyes, to <u>satisfy</u> self—not God.
- (17:7-13) False religion loves to incorporate people with an
 established <u>pedigree</u> or well-known for their <u>heritage</u> in the
 true church so that they can display the image of <u>legitimacy</u> and
 further claim the things and name of God for their own
 purposes, which are always motivated by <u>pride</u> and <u>greed</u>.
- 4. (18:1-2) False religion replaces God's <u>original</u> plan and instructions with a similar looking <u>counterfeit</u>.
- 5. (18:3-6) False religion attracts <u>kindred</u> spirits that are just as eager to please self and satiate greed as their own self. They attract significant numbers because they're good at telling people what they want to <u>hear</u>, people disposed to <u>pleasing</u> their self rather than God.
- (18:7-13) False religion destroys the <u>innocent</u> in the name of Christ, even claiming that it is His will that they do so. Their true motivation, however, is to <u>enrich</u> themselves and satisfy their <u>greed</u>.
- 7. (18:14-20) False religion is not content with <u>creating</u> something for itself alone; it always seeks to become part of the established and recognized <u>legitimate</u> church of Christ. This is

- because it originates with Satan who desires to destroy the <u>things</u> of Christ.
- 8. (18:21-26) False religion uses the terms and appearance of conformity to Christianity to <u>justify</u> themselves. They take—usually with no apologies—from their original source and redefine it as their own, resorting to <u>threats</u> and <u>intimidation</u> of anyone seeking to expose them.
- 9. (18:27-31) The final destination of false religion is the inevitable result of their consistent **behavior** and repeated **choices** contrary to God's Word and ways: **judgment** and **destruction**.
