1 Samuel 12 • Facing the Truth of Failure

- 1. (v.1-5) The best preparation before confronting another with the truth is to remove any existing, <u>personal issues</u> between you.
- 2. (v.6-13) The truth is often a casualty when people want someone else to fight spiritual battles for them.
- 3. (v.14-18) We are concerned with each individual's handling of the truth because it affects both them <u>individually</u> and us <u>collectively</u> as a church.
- 4. (v.19-25) The undiminished truth needs to be accompanied by the hope of <u>reconciliation</u>.
- 5. (v.19-25) The communicator of absolute truth must be willing to be part of the <u>solution</u>, what the Bible calls "<u>discipleship</u>".

Overall: The goal of revealing failure to embrace God's truth is not to make a person feel <u>inferior</u>, but to recognize their need <u>to change</u> going forward. <u>Obedience</u> — no matter how delayed — always cures <u>disobedience</u>.
