1.	(v.1-3) Saul has set himself as the center of all things displacing God's authority in his life; David has set himself apart in the course of yielding to God's authority in his life.
2.	(v.4-7) David never assumed that the circumstances automatically meant it must be from <u>God</u> , even when <u>others</u> claimed so. He always <u>inquired</u> of the <u>Lord</u> to know for sure.
3.	(v.8-15) Operating according to <u>God's</u> ways provides the opportunity for those operating according to <u>man's</u> ways to repent and return to <u>God's</u> ways.
4.	(v.16-19) Repentance is a powerful <u>testimony</u> to others who are pursuing their own ways.
5.	(v.20-22) Ultimately Saul recognized the <u>consequences</u> of his ways and acknowledged their giving way to <u>God's</u> ways through
