Outline of Job: Disasters (1-2), Discourses (3-41), and Deliverance (42)

- 1. (v.1-5) Job's character:
 - a. "Blameless" = "Can find no fault in"
 - b. "Upright" = "Righteous in regards to understanding both the law of the land and the law of God"
 - c. "Fearing God" = "Reverent and humble towards God"
 - d. "Turning Away From Evil" = "Always doing the right thing"
 - e. Job represents a sincere, complete believer living according to God's Word and way <u>personally</u>, in his <u>marriage</u> (v.2:10), and as a <u>parent</u>. (v.1:4-5). He is faithful in **ALL** <u>relationships</u>.
- (v.1-5) To "curse" is more than just wishing something bad will happen, but an <u>official pronouncement</u> bad things will happen. (Examples are the serpent and Cain.) To curse God is turning against God to such a degree that, if possible, they could <u>cause</u> bad things to happen to God.
- 3. (v.6-12) The temptations come from <u>Satan</u>, but the test comes from <u>God</u>.
- 4. (v.13-22) Job passes the test not just by refusing to <u>curse God</u>, but instead by <u>blessing God</u>.
- 5. Summary: The ultimate work of Satan/evil in the world is based on the question, "Will you curse God or not?"
