Job 42 • God is Always in Control

 (v.1-6) Man has neither the understanding nor the power to hold God <u>accountable</u> for His <u>actions</u>—even suffering. Spiritual things are taking place outside of our <u>knowledge</u> for which we have to <u>trust</u> God.

2. (v.7-17) God does not condemn for asking why, only those who presume to speak for Him.

The Greatest Lesson of Job:

In Job God allowed an <u>innocent</u> man to suffer for His purposes in the course of dealing with <u>evil</u> (<u>Satan</u>); it foreshadows when God will allow the most <u>innocent</u> man of all to suffer and die on the <u>cross</u> in the ultimate confrontation with <u>evil</u> (<u>Satan</u>).
