Psalm 119 • Daleth, He & Vav (#4-6)

- (v.25-32) Daleth (τ): <u>A Cure for the Blues</u>. Obedience to God's Word and ways even when one is <u>personally</u> and <u>emotionally</u> low provides the appropriate remedy where it matters most: the <u>heart</u>.
- 2. (v.33-40) He (n): <u>The Biblical Definition of "Revival"</u>. Note how these combine to describe a lifestyle of <u>putting</u> God's Word into <u>practice</u> and not merely obtaining <u>knowledge</u>.
- 3. (v.41-48) Vav (1): <u>The Cycle of the Word in the Saved</u>. The <u>work</u> of salvation can never be separated from the <u>working</u> of God's Word either <u>within us</u> personally or <u>through us</u> to others.

For Small Group Leaders to summarize these three lessons:

Overall Application

Q: In each of these examples, what condition is being addressed?

- (v.25-32) God's Word is essential when the <u>heart</u> needs restoration.
- (v.33-40) God's Word is essential when one's <u>spiritual walk</u> needs restoration.
- (v.41-48) God's Word is essential when one's <u>soul</u> needs restoration.

The answer is often not exclusively produced by a prayer request for divine <u>intervention</u> or a <u>supernatural</u> "fix", but often in combination with the Word where they have already been <u>addressed</u>.
