Ecclesiastes 10 • There is No Guarantee

- 1. (v.1-4) Wisdom does not guarantee that <u>sin</u> will be abolished and no longer an issue. The mark of true wisdom is spiritual <u>faithfulness</u> regardless.
- (v.5-7) From God's point of view, <u>power</u> and <u>wealth</u> are no guarantee anyone possesses what is necessary to be a biblically effective <u>leader</u>. If we're not <u>faithful</u> as a servant and common citizen, we will only multiply that <u>unfaithfulness</u> if placed in a greater <u>position</u> of power and authority.
- (v.8-11) <u>Methods</u> and <u>processes</u> are no guarantee of spiritual success; anything undertaken that is not in full <u>submission</u> to God's Word and ways is in danger of coming back to inflict the worst <u>results</u> on the very person employing those <u>methods</u> or <u>processes</u> in their own strength.
- 4. (v.12-15) One of the benefits of the wisdom of adhering to God's Word and ways is that, in the context of this present life, it provides the <u>Believer</u> with a <u>purpose</u> for the things of this life, whereas the <u>sinner</u> is <u>self-deceived</u> into viewing anything leading to God as <u>worthless</u>.
- (v.16-20) There is no guarantee that our earthly leaders or government will be <u>Christ-centered</u>, which is why Scripture commands that our first and foremost action is to hold them up in <u>prayer</u> that spiritual <u>change</u> would come and ultimately result in worldly <u>change</u>.
- Overall Application: We will never be permanently successful pursuing things according to the world's ways at the expense of God's Word and ways.
