Isaiah 43 • The Coming Redemption of Israel

- 1. (v.1-7) What began here has <u>repeated</u> itself throughout history, and has a final <u>fulfillment</u> to come in the End Times. God is not through with <u>Israel</u> yet. What happened <u>then</u> will happen <u>again</u>.
- 2. (v.8-13) There is no <u>salvation</u> for anyone apart from it being effected by <u>God</u> and <u>God</u> alone.
- 3. (v.14-21) God's plan of <u>salvation</u> while giving a primary role to <u>Israel</u> is for all <u>mankind</u>.
- 4. (v.22-24) While there is a "one-time" component to initially coming to God, the biblical definition of salvation is adhering to and walking in God's ways, forsaking the sin of the old life for obedience to the new. What was initiated has to be carried out each and every day going forward.
- (v.25-28) There is a final work of redemption yet to come both to <u>Israel</u> and through them to the <u>world</u> as outlined in End Times Scripture.
