Isaiah 49-50 • The Servant of the Lord

- (49:3, 5-13) Whereas false religions often portray a god who
 must be <u>served</u> without <u>question</u> at all costs, the Gospel reveals
 that the One True God reconciles people to Him through the
 <u>service</u> of His <u>Son</u> on their behalf.
- 2. (49:4) Just as His work did not produce <u>results</u> the way the <u>world</u> measures them, probably neither will ours.
- 3. (49:1-2; 50:4, 8-9) Christ carried out exactly what the <u>Father</u> called Him to do and He trusted Him for the <u>results</u>.
- 4. <u>Summary</u>: Three viewpoints of the will of the Father fulfilled through the Son:
 - a. From the Father to the Son
 - b. From the Son to the Father
 - c. From the <u>Son</u> to <u>us</u>.
- 5. (49:14) Sometimes God's people feel like He has <u>forgotten</u> them.
- 6. (50:1-3) In reality, the Father has not <u>forsaken</u> His people, but they have <u>forsaken</u> Him through their <u>unfaithfulness</u>.
- 7. (49:15-26) We're supposed to live looking toward the <u>Millennial</u>
 <u>Reign</u> to such a degree that we see it as already being fulfilled, thus negating any benefits of pouring ourselves into this <u>world</u>.
- 8. (50:10-11) God's people are challenged to change their behavior so that they do not merely trust Him with their lips, but follow faithfully from the heart.
