

Jeremiah 2 • Contending with God

1. (v.1-3) It begins with a reminder of the contrast between the generation who came out of **Egypt** and the one who entered **Canaan**.
2. (v.4-9) But they **forgot** about what God had done and began **seeking** other gods.
3. (v.10-19) The end result of “**apostasy**” came about because:
 - a. (v.14) Israel was to be free of **worldly** influence but instead had become both a **slave** to and **victim** of same.
 - b. (v.17) It was Israel’s own **choice** to forsake God for false gods.
 - c. (v.18a) They forsook the spiritual living **waters** of **God** for the false spiritual **water** of **Egyptian** culture and religion.
 - d. (v.18b) They forsook the spiritual living **waters** of **God** for the false spiritual **water** of **Assyrian** culture and religion.
4. (v.20-28) An apostate only cries to God when it is **too late**, when they’re about to reap the **choices** sown.
5. (v.29-37) An apostate inevitably lives in a state of complete and utter **deception**.

The Characteristics of the Apostate:

- They become immune to **discipline**.
- They do not merely ignore but destroy **messengers** of God’s Word.
- They engage in open **unfaithfulness** in their relationship with God.
- They are **deceived** to the point that they do not believe what they are doing is **sin**.
