Jeremiah 5 • How Apostasy Happens

- 1. (v.1-3) It begins with an <u>abandonment</u> of God not only in their relationship with <u>God</u>, but in their relationship with <u>each other</u>.
- 2. (v.4-6) Continued rejection of God's Word leads to <u>rebellion</u>, knowingly going against <u>God's</u> ways in favor of <u>another</u>.
- 3. (v.7-9) A key indicator of apostasy is when the things of God are devoted to the <u>pursuit</u> of one's own <u>desires</u> while rejecting <u>His</u>.
- 4. (v.10-13) The unaddressed rejection of God's Word leads to <u>rebellion</u>, <u>apostasy</u>, and finally to embracing the opposite of the <u>truth</u>. It's a process by which the <u>truth</u> is exchanged for a <u>lie</u> and even begin espousing the <u>lie</u> as the <u>truth</u>.
- (v.14-17) God's Word either <u>purifies</u> an <u>accepting</u> person making them fit for the presence of God, or <u>purges</u> an <u>unaccepting</u> person from God's presence.
- 6. (v.18-19) Where obedience to God's Word is concerned, the biblical principle is always to reap what is sown.
- 7. (v.20-29) The apostate are identified with the very characteristics of Satan himself: pride and greed.

In Summary:

- The apostate do not <u>fear</u> God.
- The apostate become spiritually **blind**.
- The apostate leave their walk with Christ for another.
- The apostate pursue the sins of the old life.
- The apostate seek <u>personal gain</u> at the expense of others.
- 8. (v.30-31) There is a lack of <u>accountability</u> at all levels. It's not just that there are false <u>prophets</u>, nor that there are just false <u>teachers</u>, but that they are encouraged by the <u>people</u> in general.
