Jeremiah 25 • God's Cup of Wrath

The **Historical** Cup of God's Judgment

- (v.1-3) The time comes when the opportunity to repent and return to God <u>runs out</u>. It comes about when response to God's Word ultimately approaches <u>zero</u>.
- (v.4-7) This is not a picture of people temporarily <u>backslidden</u> or struggling with their <u>faith</u>, but those who consistently resist God's <u>discipline</u> and decidedly choose to live according to their <u>own way</u> even though they know better.
- 3. (v.8-11) What happened to Judah at the hand of Babylon was intended by God to serve as a visible **testimony** of what it means to undergo God's **judgment**.
- 4. (v.12-14) What began literally and <u>historically</u> serves as a pattern and lesson for a greater, ultimate <u>fulfillment</u> to come.

The **Prophetic** Cup of God's Judgment

- 5. (v.15-26) A time comes when everyone must experience God's judgment for the final time.
- 6. (v.27-38) What was <u>fulfilled</u> in this historical event foreshadows a much greater and weightier final <u>fulfillment</u> yet to come.
