## Jeremiah 50-51 • The Characteristics of Babylon

- (50:1-3, 41-43) The judgment of God's wrath comes on those who forsake and completely <u>abandon</u> what amounts to both the <u>tablets</u> of the Law: loving <u>God</u> and loving <u>others</u>. It is the complete rejection of God <u>personally</u> and His <u>Law</u> completely.
- (50:9; 51:1, 11-12) It is the same for <u>Babylon</u> just as it is for every nation and individual. God holds <u>everyone</u> accountable not only for their <u>relationship</u> with Him, but for their <u>relationship</u> and <u>treatment</u> of others.
- 3. (50:11) When God's judgment falls on someone we're supposed to learn the <u>lesson</u> for ourselves so as not to <u>repeat</u> it, not take it as a <u>license</u> to act in furtherance of our own <u>sin</u>.
- (51:51; 50:32; 50:38; 51:7) Babylon doesn't merely conquer <u>literally</u>, but also conquers <u>spiritually</u>. <u>Physical</u> enslavement to Babylon eventually culminates in <u>spiritual</u> enslavement to the <u>gods</u> of Babylon.

<u>Summary</u>: These are the same characteristics of the last <u>Babylon</u> to come who is rooted in <u>pride</u>, <u>seduces</u> the whole world, and makes <u>war</u> on God both against His people and against Him personally. The spirit of <u>Babylon</u> is repeated throughout <u>history</u>

- (51:56-58) Babylon's physical <u>sins</u> reflect her even greater spiritual <u>sins</u>, and so her physical <u>judgment</u> reflects her even greater spiritual <u>judgment</u>.
- (50:40) The comparison to Sodom and Gomorrah reflects
   Babylon's <u>lifestyle</u> violating every commandment of God not
   just in their treatment of <u>others</u>, but of <u>God</u> personally. The
   inevitable result is the <u>fire</u> of God's judgment.
- 7. (51:59-64) In truth, Babylon cannot be <u>healed</u> and the only biblical option is for God's people to <u>come out</u> of her because of her total rejection of <u>God's Word</u>.

<u>Overall</u>: Every occurrence in Scripture concerning <u>Babylon</u> is the Holy Spirit trying to teach us something about the final <u>Babylon</u> to come.
