Ezekiel 8-10 • Where is the Glory of God?

A. Abominations

- 1. (8:5-6) Some abominations are publicly <u>visible</u> and confuse outside observers as to who is being <u>worshiped</u>.
- (8:7-13) Some abominations are only visible from within where the things of God are misused in devotion to another word not God's.
- 3. (v.8:14-15) Spiritual abominations become visibly evident by spiritual unfaithfulness.
- 4. (v. 8:16-18) In the end, abominations result in knowingly <u>turning one's</u> <u>back</u> to God.

<u>Summary</u>: God did not initiate this. It all came about because of **MAN'S** forsaking of God's <u>Word</u> and <u>covenant</u>

B. Judgment

- 1. (v.9:1-2) Abominations invoke God's judgment.
- 2. (v.9:3a) Abominations result in God's presence <u>leaving</u>.
- 3. (v.9:3b-7) God's judgment always begins first where abominations take place: His house.
- 4. (v.9:8-11) God <u>marks</u> the remnant to be saved. <u>Unfaithfulness</u> is judged for destruction, <u>righteousness</u> is judged for salvation.
- 5. (v.10:1-2) God gives many opportunities for <u>reconciliation</u>, but eventually they come to an end.

Summary: God's presence leaves.

C. When God's Glory Returns

- 1. Matthew 24: Christ departs the temple and gives His End Times discourse from the Mt. of Olives.
- 2. Luke 24:50-51: Christ **DOES NOT** ascend from the Mt. of Olives, but Bethany.
- 3. Zechariah 14:4: The Mt. of Olives is the place where Christ will ultimately return

D. Personal Application (1 Cor. 6:18-20)

- Just as the Shekinah glory dwelt in the temple, so the <u>Holy Spirit</u> dwells in us.
- 2. We are to <u>"flee immorality"</u>, the most common form of idolatry and false worship.
- Indulgence in sin results in the quenching, or "grieving", of the <u>Holy</u>
 Spirit.
- The spirit of prophecy at work in the church today is the <u>teaching of</u>
 <u>His Word</u>, warning against unfaithfulness and encouraging
 righteousness.
- 5. In the Last Days, judgment will begin with the church, not the world.
