Ezekiel 25 • They Will Know God's Vengeance

- (v.1-7) Those who are unrepentant and remain spiritually unchanged will think that His judgment on others somehow justifies their own false beliefs.
- 2. (v.8-11) The unrepentant often see God's judgment of His people as a <u>void</u> that they themselves can <u>fill</u>.
- 3. (v.12-14) The unrepentant often believe to begin with that they occupy the rightful place reserved for God's people.
- 4. (v.15-17) The unrepentant only <u>realize</u> their true spiritual condition when it is <u>too late</u>.

Summary: Types of Enemies of God's People

- <u>Ammon</u>: Someone who merely wants to see God's people rendered <u>ineffective</u>. It is enough for them that the external things of God employed by God's people are brought to an <u>end</u>. They are a third party who <u>stands by</u> and does nothing to help God's people but don't necessarily act <u>directly</u> against them.
- Moab: Someone who wants to see God's working itself rendered <u>ineffective</u>. They have the <u>pride</u> of Satan which seeks to <u>replace</u> the very nature and standing of God Himself with another in His place. They take every opportunity to undermine God's people <u>directly</u>.
- Edom: Someone who although they have forsaken a right relationship with God want to regain it by some other means, usually by destroying and replacing those with a right and proper relationship with Him. They take overt action to not just undermine the relationship of God's people with Him but if possible to replace it completely.
- <u>Philistia</u>: The out-and-out <u>enemy</u> who are not just content to influence or undermine God's people, but will not <u>rest</u> until they are <u>literally</u> destroyed and obliterated.

All cults and false religions <u>act</u> in character with one of these nations. Although they may not literally exist as nations today, they all exist as spiritual <u>strategies</u> at work in the world at large.
