Ezekiel 34 • The Shepherds & the Sheep

- 1. (v.1-6) Being a shepherd of God is all about the <u>care</u> and <u>feeding</u> of His sheep and <u>pursuing</u> them when they stray. It's much more than merely <u>leading</u> them, and requires constant <u>living</u> out among the sheep to do a good job not requiring the sheep to <u>come</u> to them.
- 2. (v.7-10) The effects of false shepherds have far-reaching repercussions in that their weakening the flock from the inside induces weakness to attacks from the outside.
- 3. (v.11-16) Christ's example of what service to God is supposed to mean was revealed when He went out <u>directly</u> to feed and heal the people rather than bring them <u>centrally</u> to the <u>Temple</u>.
- (v.17-22) There is never a situation where we are not <u>accountable</u> for the quality of our <u>love</u> to, and <u>service</u> for, others.
- 5. (v.23-24) There is no <u>room</u> for both a false shepherd and the Great Shepherd.
- 6. (v.25-31) The ultimate work of the Great Shepherd still to come is the spiritual <u>reconciliation</u> of the whole <u>flock</u> of Israel.
