Obadiah • The Classic Struggle

- 1. (v.1-4) Because pride deceives to the point of making one believe they are <u>untouchable</u>, even <u>invincible</u>, they think they're <u>above</u> God's Word, will and ways.
- 2. (v.5-6) Pride is the source of <u>Satan's</u> character, an example showing that <u>destruction</u> is the inevitable response of God to take care of it.
- 3. (v.7-9) Pride deprives one of the spiritual <u>discernment</u> necessary to see where <u>bad</u> relationships ultimately lead or the benefits of <u>right</u> relationships.
- 4. (v.10-14) The chief tactic of the prideful is to let others do as much of the <u>work</u> as possible beforehand so they can pounce when most <u>vulnerable</u> and <u>weak</u>.
- 5. (v.15-18) The same judgment which causes the <u>faithful</u> to <u>return</u> to the Lord results in permanent <u>separation</u> for the <u>prideful</u>.
- (v.19-21) The final fulfillment of all of God's promises have a
 <u>dual</u> fulfillment in that one day Israel will be both <u>physically</u> and
 <u>spiritually</u> restored.
