Matthew 17 • The Kingdom, The Power & The Glory

- 1. (v.1-13) "Thy Kingdom Come"
 - a. Representatives of the Millennial Kingdom to come:
 - 1)The Apostles represent **Israel**.
 - 2) Moses represents all who will be resurrected.
 - 3) Elijah represents all who will be raptured.
 - 4)Those at the base of the mountain represent the nations.
 - b. Representatives of the whole Word of God:
 - 1)Moses represents the <u>Law</u>.
 - 2)Elijah represents the **Prophets**.
 - 3)The Apostles represent the **New Testament**.
 - 4)All are subordinate to Christ. (Rom. 10:4; Acts 10:43)
 - c. Representatives of the "episunagoge": (1 Th. 4:13-18)
 - 1) <u>Jesus</u>—"For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven..."
 - 2) Moses—"...the dead in Christ will rise first".
 - 3) Elijah—"Then we who are alive and remain will be caught up together with them..."
 - 4) The Mount—"...in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air..."
 - d. Every prophetic fulfillment for Christ's First Coming came about according to <u>God's</u> will, not <u>man's</u> wishes; the fulfillment of God's entire Word is embodied in <u>Christ</u>, not in individual <u>events</u>. Likewise it shall be for the Second Coming.
- 2. (v.14-21) "Thy Will Be Done"
 - a. We are expected to <u>live</u> in the interim while Christ is away in the very same manner as if He were with us, in <u>faith</u> accompanied by <u>prayer</u> and <u>fasting</u>.

- 3. (v.22-23) "On Earth As It Is In Heaven"
 - a. (v.22-23) Participation in the Second Coming is <u>impossible</u> without first experiencing the First Coming.
 - b. (v.24-27) All the <u>needs</u> of this life will be properly addressed in the pursuit of a life of <u>faith</u> in Christ.
 - i. This is the only time Christ performed a miracle to meet <u>His own</u> needs. (Philip. 2:5-8)
 - ii. This is the most **complicated** miracle. (Heb. 2:8)
 - This is the only miracle which uses money. (1Pe. 1:17-19)
 - iv. This miracle was performed just for <u>Peter</u>. (1 Pe. 5:6-7)
- 4. <u>Overall Application</u>: The Mount of Transfiguration is a glimpse of our <u>future</u> assurance, while in the mean time we faithfully await the fulfillment of that vision by a life of <u>faith</u> accompanied by <u>prayer</u> and <u>fasting</u> in the meantime. However, we must avoid being so <u>heavenly</u> minded that we are no <u>earthly</u> good.
