Matthew 26-28 • In the Garden

- 1. (Gen. 2:8-9, 15-18, 22) The First Garden: The Garden of Eden.
- 2. (Gen. 3:1-7) It is a <u>choice</u> to pursue one's own desire instead of God's <u>Word</u>.
- 3. (Gen. 3:14-17a) Everyone's sin had to be dealt with.
- 4. (Gen. 3:22-24) The Garden of Eden is a picture of everyone's participation in God's <u>salvific</u> plan.
- 5. (Mt. 23:36-46) The <u>Second</u> Garden: The Garden of <u>Gethsemane</u>.
 - a. The first Adam was tempted and <u>failed</u>, the Second Adam is tempted and does not <u>fail</u>.
 - b. The focus of the first Garden <u>strays</u> from the Father, the second Garden never <u>strays</u> from the Father.
 - c. In both Gardens each of the Adams' helpers failed.
 - d. The first Adam did not discern the motives of <u>Satan</u> his betrayer through <u>Eve</u>, the Second Adam was acutely aware of <u>Satan</u> the betrayer through <u>Judas</u>.
 - e. The Second Garden goes further into God's salvific plan.
- 6. (Mt. 27:56-61) Jesus' <u>tomb</u> is in a garden, just as <u>death</u> was found in the First Garden.
- 7. (Mt. 27:62-66) Both gardens had guards set at their entrance.
- 8. (Mt. 28:1-7) The Garden of Victory vs. the Garden of Defeat
 - a. The first Garden produced failure and <u>defeat</u>; this Garden produces <u>victory</u>.

- Mankind was thrown out of the first Garden and a guard placed at its entrance; the guard and stone covering this entrance has been removed.
- The man's helpmate conveyed the words and desires of <u>Satan</u> in the first Garden; here man's helpmate conveys <u>God's</u>.
- Because of sin in the first Garden man <u>ran and hid</u> from God; victory over sin here led man to <u>run and seek</u> God.
- 9. (Mt. 28:8-9) In the first Garden God first deals with <u>Satan</u> and then the <u>woman</u>; so it is in the Second Garden.
- 10. (Mt. 28:16-20) In the first Garden fellowship with God is **broken**; in the second Garden fellowship with God is **restored**.
- 11. Bonus Question: Where is the Third Garden?
 - a. Revelation 22:1-2
 - b. First there is <u>creation</u> the First Garden.
 - c. Second there is <u>re-creation</u> the Second Garden.
 - d. Finally there is **new creation** The Third Garden
