## Luke 6:1-19 • The Authority of Christ

- 1. (v.1-5) Jesus the Ruler
  - a. When something was not specifically spelled out in God's Word they were supposed to apply the Law, not make up more laws.
  - b. We are supposed to know the difference between the "letter" of the Law and the "spirit" of the Law. (Col. 2:13-17)
- 2. (v.6-11) Jesus the Healer
  - a. When it comes to the Law their problem is:
    - The First <u>Tablet</u>: They do not love <u>God</u> with all their heart.
    - ii. The Second <u>Tablet</u>: They do not love <u>others</u> with all their heart.
    - iii. They want their <u>traditions</u> to be the final authority.
  - b. Both <u>Tablets</u> must be kept in equal <u>tension</u> or serious error results.
  - c. Signs and wonders work for <u>renewal</u> in hearts which love God and work for <u>judgment</u> in hearts which do not.
- 3. (v.12-16) Jesus the **Master** 
  - a. Those who cannot <u>apply</u> His Word will be replaced by those who <u>can</u>. (Is. 55:11)

- 4. (v.17-19) Jesus the Example
  - a. Those who refuse to accept and apply the spirit of the Law will be left in favor of someone else who will.

## Summary:

- The earthly use authority to rule at the <u>expense</u> of loving others; the heavenly as an example of how to <u>fulfill</u> the Law of love.
- The earthly are <u>unchanged</u> by signs and wonders because tradition means more to them than truth; the heavenly are <u>transformed</u> by them because they put truth into practice.
- The earthly are such a failure at keeping the Law they actually become a <u>hindrance</u>; the heavenly are raised in their place to properly <u>apply</u> the Law.
