John 7:37-8:59 • Simchat Torah

- 1. (7:37-39) Draws on the imagery of Ezekiel 47 which teaches about Messiah's Millennial Reign.
- 2. (7:40-42) They expected the Messiah to come at this time but expected Him to come according to their <u>own desires</u>.
- (7:43-53) Jesus is speaking <u>spiritually</u>, the people are thinking <u>physically</u>.
- 4. (8:1-11) Although the people have the <u>Law</u>, they misapply the <u>Law</u>.
- (8:12-20) They were unwilling to accept any <u>testimony</u> or <u>witness</u> where Christ was concerned.
- 6. (8:21-27) No one understands the meaning of Christ's teaching until they accept Him as Messiah.
- 7. (8:28-30) Just as Christ's Word and actions were an imitation of the Father's, so ours must be of Christ's if we believe Him.
- 8. (8:31-32) It's not how you <u>feel</u> about the Word but how you put it into <u>practice</u>.
- 9. (8:33-46) **NOT** putting the Word into practice and pursuing habitual sin results in having the wrong spiritual **father**.
- 10. (8:47-55) **ALL** of God's Word is fulfilled for us only if we prove we "know" Christ by keeping His Word.
- 11. (8:56-59) It always comes down to accepting Christ as nothing less than the **Son of God**.

<u>Celebration #1</u>: The Feast of Booths – The Millennial Reign of the Messiah

Celebration #2: The "Simchat Torah" – "The Joy of the Torah"

Celebration #3: Hanukah – The Festival of Miracles and Light

12. (Lev.23:42-24:7)

- a. John 7 is the fulfillment of Leviticus 23, the Feast of Tabernacles (or Booths)
- b. John 8 is the fulfillment of Leviticus 24, the Simchat Torah and the new holiday Hanukah
- c. First comes the <u>grain</u> (the Word), then the <u>oil</u> (illumination by the Spirit), then <u>worship</u>. There is no "<u>doxology</u>" without "<u>theology</u>".
- 13. (Lev. 24:10-15) The greater spiritual meaning behind stoning is an illustration of <u>condemnation</u> by the Law, illustrating why we need a <u>Savior</u>.
 - a. The stones stored on Solomon's porch were the broken altar desecrated by Antiochus Epiphanes IV.
 - b. The people expected the Messiah to return during Hanukah and tell them what to do with the stones.
 - c. Their picking them up to stone the very Messiah who came when expected was the ultimate rejection of God's Word, both the Law and its fulfillment in Christ.
