John 15:1-12 • How to Abide in Christ

- 1. (v.1-12) *Overview*: Seven of the ten references to "abide" place the responsibility of this action on <u>us</u>. (See Jn. 6:56; 1 Jn. 2:6; 2 Jn. 9; Ja. 1:25)
- 2. (v.1-3) To "abide" in Christ we must bear spiritual fruit.
- 3. (v.4) It is impossible to bear spiritual fruit on one's <u>own</u> apart from <u>Christ</u>.
- 4. (v.5-6) Not bearing spiritual fruit leads to being <u>cut off</u> from the nutrition supplied by the Vine, spiritually <u>drying up</u>, and eventually <u>cast aside</u> and <u>burned</u>.
- 5. (v.7) To "abide" in Christ is to show consistent <u>obedience</u> to His <u>Word</u>, proving His <u>Word</u> "abides" in us.
- 6. (v.8) Bearing spiritual fruit is the biblical proof someone is a disciple and not merely a convert.
- 7. (v.9-10) The Son's <u>relationship</u> with the Father is the ultimate example of an abiding <u>relationship</u>, rooted in obedience to the <u>Word</u>.
- 8. (v.11) Biblical obedience is not **prohibitive** but actually **freeing**.
- (v.12) Biblical love comes from first being <u>obedient</u> to Christ, rooted in God's <u>Word</u>, and holding others to the same <u>standard</u>.
