John 18 • Non-Believers' Reaction to Christ

1.	(v.1-6) When confronted by the call of Christ, non-believers are
	repulsed and fall away from Him; believers are humbled, fall
	toward Him, and worship Him.

 (v.19-24) Non-believers are incapable of passively ignoring His <u>Word</u> and feel compelled to actively silence the <u>message</u>; in their rejection of His <u>Word</u> they become His enemy.

3. (v.28-32) Non-believers will escalate their efforts to <u>silence</u>
Christ's Word to the point of physical <u>persecution</u> and <u>death</u> in order to <u>silence</u> the messenger.

4. (v.33-38a) If they can't silence the message, nor silence the messenger, non-believers attempt to <u>redefine</u> it into something <u>trivial</u> and <u>unsupportable</u>.

 (v.38b-40) Non-believers work through various stages of deeper and deeper <u>rejection</u> of Christ, seeking to silence His Word both <u>publicly</u> and <u>personally</u>. They replace Him altogether with <u>something</u> or <u>someone</u> else.
