## Acts 7 • God's Will for Israel Explained

- 1. (6:11-14) That <u>generation</u> of Jesus' time repeated the same mistakes of previous <u>generations</u>.
- (v.1-8) Their true heritage was not <u>lineage</u> to Abraham and Moses, but to <u>serve</u> God and be <u>obedient</u> to <u>ALL</u> His Law and Promises.
- (v.9-16) Israel's historical pattern is to be <u>self-seeking</u> and <u>disobedient</u>, always missing what <u>God</u> was really doing.
- 4. (v.17-21) Like Moses, Christ was born under a <u>death sentence</u> and at a time when Israel was subjugated to another <u>ruler</u>.
- 5. (v.22-29) Just as Moses was in the right <u>time</u> and right <u>place</u> but <u>rejected</u> the first time by the Jews, so was Christ.
- (v.30-34) The symbolism of the burning bush that Israel underwent the fire of <u>affliction</u> in Egypt but was not <u>consumed</u> by it is subsequently applied to the <u>Church</u> coming out of Israel.
- 7. (v.35-40) Just as Israel ended up blaspheming <u>Moses</u> through their disobedience and unbelief, so they repeat the same in regard to <u>Christ</u>.
- 8. (v.41-43) The true legacy of Israel is consistent <u>rejection</u> of Abraham, Moses, the Law, and the Temple in favor of <u>idolatry</u> and false <u>worship</u>.
- 9. (v.44-50) The end result was embracing a false <u>tabernacle</u> (<u>Temple</u>) over the true one.
- 10. (v.51-53) Israel's chief impediments:
  - a. They were stiff-necked.

- b. They were **uncircumcised** in both their heart **AND** ears.
- c. They <u>resisted</u> the Holy Spirit.
- d. The followed in the footsteps of their **fathers**.
- 11. Stephen's "hope" vs. Jewish "hope": one looks <u>forward</u>, relinquishing the past and finding its fulfillment in <u>Christ</u>; the other clings to the <u>past</u> never finding fulfillment because it never really <u>existed</u> in the first place.
