Acts 15:1-35 • The Law vs. Grace

- (v.1-2) This is not about establishing some kind of church <u>hierarchy</u>, but the direction of the Spirit to bring <u>unity</u> where <u>doctrine</u> is concerned.
- 2. (v.3-21) <u>Fellowship</u> and <u>ministry</u> were not by-passed in order to get to the "more important" business on hand.
 - a. Whereas Israel was exclusively designated as "God's people",
 God is now taking from <u>every nation</u>.
 - God will return to the work first begun <u>in Israel</u> to complete it at the last.
 - c. It is no longer "saved by the Law", but "saved by grace". This is the transition point from the <u>Old</u> to <u>New Covenant</u>, the transition from "Peter" to "Paul".
- 3. (v.22-35) Not <u>dogmas</u> handed down by men, but the leading of the Holy Spirit to attain <u>unity of doctrine</u>.
 - a. The common ground is to separate from <u>false worship</u> and <u>influences</u>.
 - The practical effect was being more deeply rooted in <u>God's</u> <u>Word</u>.

4. Summary

- a. It began with a dispute concerning the proper application of the Word of God.
- b. The discussion was guided by the Word of God.
- The final judgment was rendered according to the <u>Word of</u>
 <u>God</u>.
- But the proper attitude and behavior of love and fellowship were never compromised in the course of pursuing the <u>Word</u> <u>of God</u>.
- 5. Today's Tragedy (Gal. 1:6-9)
 - Pursuing the early part of Acts to bring in the <u>kingdom</u> without the latter revelation of the role of the <u>church</u>
 - b. Some try to make strange combinations of law and grace, lsrael and the church, kingdom truth and church truth.
