Acts 27-28:10 • Allowing God to Control the Path

- 1. (27:1) Before the journey begins, the work of the **Gospel** has already begun.
- 2. (27:7-12) Differences of opinion will occur along the way.
- 3. (27:13-15) <u>Circumstances</u> are often beyond our control; we may have to "go with the <u>flow</u>".
- 4. (27:15-20) It is often a <u>process</u> to get us to submit to something <u>greater</u> than ourselves.
- 5. (27:21-26) The physical circumstances should never be allowed to overwhelm us to the point that we cease functioning spiritually.
- 6. (27:27-29) It will probably not happen in the <u>way</u> or <u>timing</u> we envisioned.
- 7. (27:30-32) The end result may come about by <u>divine</u> intervention, but God often chooses to use <u>earthly</u> resources to obtain the end result.
- (27:33-38) If we cannot change the <u>circumstances</u> leading to the fulfillment of His purpose, we are therefore completely **IN** His <u>purpose</u> and should never forsake communicating with and acknowledging <u>Him</u>.
- 9. (27:39-44) The manner in which the Holy Spirit works is often not according to our **desire**; something **greater** Is at work.
- 10. (28:1-6) There will always be an opportunity to <u>witness</u> for the Gospel either by <u>personal</u> example or to those needing to <u>hear</u> it.
- 11. (28:7-10) What we originally <u>set out</u> to do, and what the Holy Spirit ultimately <u>accomplishes</u>, are often completely <u>different</u> things.
