Romans 13 • Christianity & Politics

 (v.1-4) The first motive for obedience to government is for wrath's sake, to avoid punishment that is deserved for earthly disobedience.

 (v.5-7) The second motive for obedience to government is for <u>conscience</u> sake because a Spirit-directed <u>conscience</u> lifts us to a <u>higher</u> level.

3. (v.8-10) The third motive is for the sake of <u>love</u>.

4. (v.11-14) The fourth motive is for the <u>Savior's</u> sake by living in the <u>Spirit</u> rather than the <u>flesh</u>.

Application: Paul lists the motives from <u>lowest</u> to <u>highest</u>, from fear, to conscience, to love, to devotion to Christ. They all have in common being a visible testimony which contrasts a <u>Spirit-filled</u> Believer in a world controlled by its <u>lusts</u>. The world is defined by "<u>lawlessness</u>", the Spirit-filled Believer as <u>law abiding</u>.
