Galatians 3 • The Law & Grace, Part I

- 1. (v.1-5) The <u>personal</u> argument: The proof of salvation by grace and not the Law is proved by the <u>personal</u> salvation <u>experience</u> itself.
- 2. (v.6-14) The <u>scriptural</u> argument: No one has ever been <u>saved</u> by doing the Law because no one can fully <u>obey</u> the Law as proven by the <u>Old Testament</u> itself.

- 3. (v.15-18) The <u>logical</u> argument: The <u>Mosaic Law</u> cannot cancel out God's covenant with Abraham. <u>Promise</u> and faith go together, never <u>promise</u> and the Law.
 - a. (v.19-20) The Law was temporary and intended only for Israel.
 - b. (v.21-22) The Law reveals our desperate need for God's grace.
 - c. (v.23-29) The Law was provided temporarily until its **fulfillment** in Christ.
