1 Thessalonians 4 • Characteristics of the Christian Life

- 1. (v.1-2) The primary focus is to put into <u>practice</u> what we already know.
- 2. (v.3a) God assesses us based on our commitment to be <u>set</u> apart and devoted <u>exclusively</u> to Him.
- 3. (v.3b-8) Sanctification is the sum or our choices to behave according to **God's Word** rather than our own **desire**.
- 4. (v.9-12) Biblical sanctification is characterized by biblical <u>love</u> that applies to biblical <u>truth</u> to our personal <u>relationships</u> both inside and outside the Church.
- 5. (v.13-18) Biblical <u>hope</u> testifies to future End Times events through a biblically <u>obedient</u> life.

This provides the fulfillment of 1:3-4 individually:

- 1. The "work of <u>faith</u>" is <u>sanctification</u>, being personally obedient as in a faithful marital relationship with Christ.
- 2. The "labor of <u>love</u>" is <u>loving deeper</u>, not being satisfied with the status quo.
- 3. The "steadfastness of <u>hope</u>" is the knowledge that this life's behavior and choices are an extension of the next.

This provides the fulfillment of 1:3-4 corporately:

- 1. The "work of <u>faith</u>" is maintaining <u>pure</u> relationships with others.
- The "labor of <u>love</u>" is living a <u>visibly</u> exemplary life as a <u>witness</u>
 to others, being neither an emotional nor physical <u>burden</u> to
 others.
- 3. The "steadfastness of <u>hope</u>" is mutual <u>comfort</u> of our future life in Christ.

Each aspect of the personal application fulfills the <u>First Tablet</u> to love God with all our heart, soul and mind; each aspect of the group application fulfills the <u>Second Tablet</u> to love our neighbor as our self.
