Hebrews 10:32-12:3 • The Meaning of "Faith"

- 1. (10:32-39) The key word biblically associated with the true meaning of "faith" is "endurance".
- (11:1-3) The beginning of "faith" is believing in the power of God's Word.
- 3. (v.4) "Faith" is seeing and understanding the greater meaning behind the things of God.
- 4. (v.5-6) "Faith" is living this life, knowing we'll never actually die.
- 5. (v.7) We do good works **because** of "faith", not in order to **obtain** it.
- 6. (v.8-12) "Faith" does not return to the old life but <u>follows</u> God wherever led according to His <u>pleasure</u>.
- 7. (v.13-16) A person with "faith" does not consider themselves to be a <u>citizen</u> of this world.
- 8. (v.17-19) Biblical "faith" requires trusting in God's Word and ways even when it's not fully revealed "why".
- 9. (v.20) Biblical "faith" knows God's Word will come to pass, even if not until <u>future generations</u>.
- 10. (v.21) "Faith" trusts God to accomplish His Word by His own means.
- 11. (v.22) Biblical "faith" does not place its trust in the <u>old</u> life but the <u>new</u>.

- 12. (v.23-29) Biblical "faith" sees the greater teachings and lessons pointing to Christ behind the Word and workings of God.
- 13. (v.30) "Faith" is evidenced by doing things God's way.
- 14. (v.31) "Faith" transcends the Law and is the bridge for ALL mankind.
- 15. (v.32-40) The defining characteristic of biblical "faith" is **enduring** all things for the sake of **Christ**.
- 16. (v.12:1-3) The proper application of biblical "faith" is rejecting <u>sin</u>, <u>enduring</u> earthly circumstances, and fixed on <u>Jesus</u>.

Note: Not a single example was given that if a person has "faith" they can cause a <u>sign</u> or <u>wonder</u>. Every example given is actually an example of <u>faithfulness</u> – obedience to God's Word and ways.

Overall Application

- God works through faith and faith alone. Exercising faith is the only way to <u>please</u> Him and receive His <u>blessing</u>.
- Faith is a gift from God through the Word and the Spirit. It is not something we "work up" for ourselves.
- Faith is always <u>tested</u>. Although at times it seems foolish to trust God, faith always conquers in the end.
- To complete the work of faith, one always needs endurance.
