James 5 • End Times Faith

- 1. (v.1-6) In the Last Days, the wrong application of <u>material</u> <u>wealth</u> will lead many astray.
- (v.7-11) We must be <u>patient</u> to <u>endure</u> faithfully even when we are wronged. We must trust that the injustices and inequities of this present life will probably go <u>unresolved</u> in this life. This is why we look forward to Christ's <u>return</u>, when the Judge will <u>resolve</u> all things.
- 3. (v.12) We are called not just to keep our speech pure where fellow **Christians** are concerned, but with **everyone**.
- 4. (v.13-18) The more consistent our faithfulness in times of **peace**, the better the chances it will translate into the kind of faith we'll need in times of **trial** and **hardship**.
- (v.19-20) Regardless of how bad the <u>circumstances</u> prison, in the midst of a shipwreck, persecution, etc. – the apostles always realized that this very situation was an opportunity to <u>win souls</u> for the Kingdom.

Overall Application:

- (v.1-11) Be <u>patient</u> and <u>endure</u>, even if you are wronged.
- (v.12) Remain <u>pure</u> in speech.
- (v.13-18) Remain <u>prayerful</u>, continuing to confess one's sins.
- (v.19-20) Be <u>persistent</u> in winning souls for the kingdom.
