1 Peter 5 • How a Christian Acts

- 1. (v.1-4) Characteristics of the true, biblical pastor:
 - a. He is not a corporate <u>CEO</u> but a <u>shepherd</u> who lives with, cares for, and feeds the <u>flock</u> in the course of leading them. (v.1-2)
 - b. It is not simply a job to him; he serves from the heart.(v.2)
 - c. Leads by personal **example**. (v.3)
 - d. Works for <u>rewards</u> not guaranteed in this life but the one to come. (v.4)
 - e. *Overall*: True, biblical pastors are more concerned about pleasing and glorifying <u>Christ</u> than anyone else.
 And they know that this is accomplished by fulfilling His command to love and shepherd the <u>flock</u> to His glory, not their own
- 2. (v.5-7) We should allow times of <u>suffering</u> to bring us low before Him so we will be properly <u>exalted</u> when He determines we're fit and ready.
- 3. (v.8-11) First comes <u>suffering</u>, then <u>equipping</u>, <u>confirmation</u>, <u>strength</u>, and ultimately spiritual <u>perfection</u>.
- 4. (v.12-14) Personal examples of standing firm.
