## Revelation 2-3 • He Who Overcomes

- (Jn. 16:33) The biblical definition of an "overcomer" is someone who successfully <u>conquers</u>, <u>subdues</u> and has <u>victory</u> over the world; the "overtaken" are themselves <u>conquered</u> and <u>subdued</u> by the world.
- 2. (Rev. 5:4-5) Christ Himself is the ultimate <u>example</u> of what it means to be an "overcomer".
- 3. (1 Jn. 5:4-5) A born again "believer" is proven by their <u>faithfulness</u>; it is not enough to simply <u>acknowledge</u> Christ but to live in obedience to His Word.
- (Rom. 12:21) An "overcomer" is not simply passively resisting the world personally, but is actually overcoming the world by their treatment of others.
- (1 Jn. 2:13-14) An overcomer is not a part-time or casual <u>participant</u> with Christ, but takes up permanent <u>residence</u> with Him because "apart from Me you can do nothing".
- 6. (1 Jn. 4:1-6) An overcomer does not accept things at face value, but <u>tests</u> all things to validate who is <u>operating</u> according to "the spirit of truth and the spirit of error".
- 7. (2 Pe. 2:17-21) The "overtaken" are not those who never came to <a href="believe">believe</a> in Christ, but temporarily came out of the world only to return to and become <a href="re-enslaved">re-enslaved</a> to it once again.

<u>Summary to This Point</u>: The foundational understanding of what it means to "overcome" given in the NT prior to Revelation:

- It is the spiritual <u>battle</u> encompassing all the complimentary elements of the world-system's values and behavior.
- It is the biblical response to evil by choosing to do biblical good.
- It is not just <u>countering</u> the antics and tactics of Satan, but his working through false christs, false prophets, false teachers and their associated works of deception.
- The only antidote is to become **enslaved** to Christ by putting His Word and ways into practice and abiding in Him alone.

## **Part II: The Promises to Overcomers**

- (Rev. 21:7-8) The book of Revelation is itself summarized with a plain explanation of the ultimate <u>destination</u> for those who overcome versus those who are "overtaken".
- 2. (Rev. 2:7—Ephesus) Overcomers are faithful and consistent to the end so as to experience the eternal **rewards** of their **salvation**.
- 3. (Rev. 2:11—Smyrna) Overcomers can endure even the worst <u>earthly</u> circumstances because their gaze is fixed on <u>eternity</u>.
- 4. (Rev. 2:17—Pergamum) Overcomers are sustained by God's <u>Word</u> and their exclusive devotion to <u>Christ</u> alone.
- 5. (Rev. 2:26-28—Thyatira) Overcomers effectively deal with the personal issues of **immorality** and **idolatry**.
- 6. (Rev. 3:5—Sardis) Overcomers make the necessary <u>course corrections</u> while there is still the opportunity to do so.
- 7. (Rev. 3:12—Philadelphia) Overcomers recognize that everything accomplished for the Kingdom of Christ is rooted in **eternity**, even the seasons of **accomplishment** in this life.
- 8. (Rev. 3:21—Laodicea) Overcomers ensure that it is Christ alone who is always and exclusively **seated** upon the **throne** of their life.

## Overall Application (Mt. 7:21-23):

The chief characteristic of an "overcomer" is <u>faithfulness</u> in this life to God's Word and ways in order to achieve all the <u>benefits</u> of the life to come.
