## Revelation 19:1-10 • The Marriage Supper of the Lamb

- 1. Read v.1-10. What are the similarities to Rev. 18?
  - a. (18:2 vs. 19:6) The final and permanent <u>fall</u> of one kingdom gives way to the <u>rise</u> and permanent establishment of the other.
  - b. (18:4 vs. 19:9) God's people's time at the hands of the harlot Babylon comes to an end and their reward as His Bride begins.
  - c. (18:6-7 vs. 19:8) The deeds of one <u>woman</u> invoke judgment and condemnation, the deeds of the other <u>woman</u> bring reward and salvation.
  - d. (18:8 vs. 19:3) Temporary, earthly <u>judgment</u> is but a reflection of permanent, eternal <u>judgment</u>.
  - e. (18:9-20 vs. 19:1-10) Those on earth mourn the judgment of God that has come upon them and the end of everything they knew, while those in heaven celebrate that judgment as the fulfillment of God's Word and the beginning of everything God has promised.
- 2. (v.1-4, 6-7) The hallelujahs.
  - a. The first reason for joy in heaven: the judgment and victory over sin.
  - b. The second reason for joy in heaven: the establishment of God's <u>reign</u>.
  - c. The third reason for joy: the <u>marriage supper of the</u>
    <u>Lamb</u>.

- 3. (v.2-3) The joy in heaven over the judgment of sin, the reign of God and the Bride of Christ is a celebration of the fulfillment of the entire **Word of God**.
- 4. (Jn. 14:1-4) The marriage supper of the Lamb is the fulfillment in <a href="heaven">heaven</a> of what began with our relationship with Christ first initiated on <a href="earth">earth</a>.

a. Stage One: The betrothal

b. Stage Two: The marriage feast

c. Stage Three: The consummation

- (Mt. 22:1-14) The Bride makes herself <u>ready</u> not by simply believing that the Bridegroom will return, but proving it by putting His Word into practice so that she is <u>sanctified</u> devoted exclusively to Him.
- (v.9) The work of the Lamb on the <u>cross</u> is our daily assurance
   He will complete the next stage of our relationship at the
   <u>marriage supper</u> of the Lamb set before us.
- 7. (v.10) The Bride does not need a "new" <u>Word</u> but simply to put into practice the <u>Word</u> she has already been given.
